

## Exenatide, pioglitazone effective for poorly controlled T2DM

(HealthDay)—For patients with long-standing poorly controlled type 2 diabetes mellitus (T2DM) on metformin plus a sulfonylurea, combination therapy with exenatide and pioglitazone is effective and safe, according to a study published online Jan. 17 in *Diabetes Care*.

Muhammad Abdul-Ghani, M.D., Ph.D., from Hamad General Hospital in Doha, Qatar, and colleagues randomized 231 patients with poorly controlled T2DM on a sulfonylurea plus metformin to receive combination therapy (pioglitazone plus weekly exenatide) or <u>insulin therapy</u> (basal plus prandial insulin) to maintain hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c)
